High School/College Transcripts

If you are an undergraduate or graduate student in a teacher preparation program, it is imperative that we have a copy of your high school transcript sent to the Office of Academic and Student Services, 270 Huntington Hall for foreign language verification. This process needs to be completed before you graduate, so that we can clear you for graduation and the Registrar's Office can post an award date on your Syracuse University transcript. If you have taken courses through another college or university, please have an official copy of the transcript sent to the Office of Academic and Student Services, 270 Huntington Hall.

Graduation Check

If you are a second semester junior/senior or graduate student close to graduation, please email Pam (if your last name begins with A-L) or Carol (if your last name begins with M-Z). Some of the items requested will be the following:

- Official transcripts from other institutions you have attended
- Completed Program checklist
- Completed Diploma Card
- Child Health & Life Safety Seminar for New York State certification (if applicable).

Important Notice to all Graduate Students

You must be continuously registered at Syracuse University during each FALL and SPRING semester. If you are not registering for course work, register for GRD 998, “Degree in Progress” for “0” credit hours. You can register online during the registration period for that semester. If you neglect to register for coursework or GRD 998 “Degree in Progress” for “0” credits, you will become a “Discontinued Student”, and will not be able to register the following semester without reactivating.

If circumstances dictate that you have to register for “0” credit hours for an extended period of time, you must take a Leave of Absence. A Leave of Absence permits extension of the time to complete your degree a maximum of one year. Leave of Absence Forms may be obtained in the Office of Academic and Student Services, 270 Huntington Hall.

Education Career Services

The Education Career Services Office is located in 270 Huntington Hall. It offers a variety of services to all Syracuse University Education students who are seeking positions as teachers, school counselors, school psychologists, speech and language pathologists, library media specialists or administrators in

schools locally and around the country. This office does not place students in positions; rather it facilitates researching employment opportunities and assists students in the job search. Please take advantage of the following Career services:

Credential Files:

Credential files contain letters of recommendation. The credential file serves as an important source of information to potential employers. Copies of your file are sent at your email request to potential employers as part of the application process. Once a file is open, it remains active for life and you may update letters as often as necessary. Credential file packets are available in the Career Services office and there is a \$35 registration fee to establish a file. Once your file contains at least 3 letters of recommendation, then it can be sent to school districts at the request of the candidate. New York State Teacher Certification

1. What tests do I need to take and pass to be certified in New York State?

Three NYS Teacher Certification Exams (NYSTCE); which include the Liberal Arts & Science Test (LAST), the Assessment of Teaching Skills-Written Test (ATS-W) and the Content Specialty Test (CST). 2 CST's are required for Inclusive Elementary & Special Education program and the Early Childhood Special Education program (*Multi-Subject* and *Students with Disabilities*). 2. Is fingerprinting required for seeking New York State certification?

Yes. The processing fee is \$99 and must be paid in the form of a money order. Please contact Jeanne Schmidt, 150 Huntington Hall, at 314-443-1468 or jmschmidt@syr.edu for questions & appointments.

3. How do I register for the required Child Health and Life Safety Workshop?

The Child Health and Life Safety Workshop is a degree requirement as well as a New York State Department of Education certification requirement. The Office of Academic and Student Services offers the workshop continually through an online format. Please send an email to nyschlss@syr.edu to find out more information and to enroll in the seminar.

4. Is Certification automatic once I graduate?

No. You will need to complete the New York State teacher certification tests, the Child Health & Life Safety online seminar, and fingerprinting clearance. Information on how to apply for teacher certification through NYSED TEACH Online Services, will be sent to students prior to graduation.

CNY Teacher Recruitment Days

On Monday, March 26 and Tuesday, March 27, 2007, school districts from across the country will conduct interviews for known and anticipated vacancies. Students representing 15 Central New York colleges and universities will be interviewed on the SUNY College at Cortland campus. Requirements for participation include that students must be eligible for certification/licensure in Education by September 2007, and have completed a program of study between December 2006 and August 2007. Summer Courses

If you would like to take coursework at another institution and transfer the credits back to Syracuse University, you must do the following:

- Fill out a Transfer Credit Petition before leaving at the end of this semester. This petition is available in the Office of Academic and Student Services, 270 Huntington Hall.
- Attach a course description to the petition.
- Obtain permission signatures from your advisor, department chair, and the Assistant Dean for Academic and Student Services.
- File the petition with the Office of Academic and Student Services in 270 Huntington Hall. Coursework below a “C” or with Pass/Fail grading is not transferable. Transfer credits and transfer courses do not impact your GPA.

Request an official transcript from the transfer institution, and have it sent to the Office of Academic and Student Services, Syracuse University, School of Education, 270 Huntington Hall, Syracuse, NY 13244-2340.

An official e-mail address is established and assigned by Syracuse University’s Information Technology and Services for each registered student. All University communications, including School of Education news, is sent to this e-mail address.
